Things will not be the same as before, but it is our goal to create a safe environment where we can worship together again. Phase 1 will begin on June 7th, 10 a.m. with one service.

What you can expect

As we gather together again...

- Each week you will receive an email invite. This will give you the opportunity to reserve your spot at the live gathering. If you try and reserve and it's already full you will get a message that will say "sold out" - All that means is we have reach the safety capacity for that service. We will be moving to live streaming for those who want to stay home or were unable to register.
- During the first two phases, we ask that you and your children sit together during worship. There will be packets available for kids who will be sitting through the service. No children's programing will be available during this time in the children's wing.
- To better accommodate social distancing, the worship center is set up with tables and chairs to allow families to be able to sit together. Masks are encouraged but not required.
- Entrances and exits will be organized and traffic directed according to recommended guidelines.
- For those who want to enjoy the fellowship component of being at church, we respectfully ask that you gather outdoors in our lawn spaces or in the church parking lot.
- If you or your family member is feeling sick or exhibit symptoms, please do not attend in person. Live streaming of the service will continue to be available at crossroadsonline.net.
- We have made every effort to have a service that is as "touchless" as possible, from entrances to exits, bathrooms, with no passing of the offering bags. Please note that coffee service will not be available at this time. Feel free to bring your own - I know I will

KEEPING OUR BUILDING CLEAN

Crossroads has thoroughly cleaned the building before and after each gathering according to the following guidelines.

According to the CDC, Coronaviruses on surfaces and objects naturally die within hours to days. Warmer temperatures and exposure to sunlight will reduce the time the virus survives on surfaces and objects.

Normal routine cleaning with soap and water removes germs and dirt from surfaces. It lowers the risk of spreading COVID-19 infection.

EPA-Approved disinfectants are an important part of reducing the risk of exposure to COVID-19. Disinfectants kill germs on surfaces. By killing germs on a surface after cleaning, you can further lower the risk of spreading infection.
